The banquets are opportunities for the athletes, their parents and coaches to be reminded of the glory and the disappointments of the past year. The coaches are always full of praise for the effort, determination and sportsmanship of PBDA's athletes.

Mr. Caruso, athletic director, presented the Maddock Awards, which recognize athletes who won first places in two events on Field Day. Sportsmanship Award, **Alexis Rupp** received the Varsity Sportsmanship Award and **Amanda Coyle** received the Varsity Coaches Award. A Team Award was presented to **Madeline Moss**. The John L. Thompson Sportsmanship Award was presented to **Van Spina**. **Nick Griffin**, was the recipient of the Jeffrey Dodge Excellence in Athletics Award, and the Carol L. Rafter Excellence in Athletics Award was presented to **Josie Paine**.

Reflections

I'm often called a Type A personality. At times I receive this as a complement because friends are referring to my need to do things to the highest of standards. Other times, it is not that complementary because they are referring to my inability to stop and celebrate what's been accomplished. I know this comes from early childhood when I often had whispered in my ear,

*"Good, better, best
Never let it rest
'til your good is better
and your better's best."*

Since an early awareness of both the upside and downside of a Type A personality, I've tried to develop ways to keep a better balance in my life. One of the things I've learned is that it is essential to take time to reflect on the great things that have happened while asking "What more can we do?" To do that about this school year at PBDA in a 750 word Reflection would be impossible, but I'm going to try to capture a few highlights.

Pride in our Students

- 93% of our 8th and 9th grade students will be attending their first choice school.
- In grades 1 and 2, 54% of our students qualified for the John Hopkins CTY Talent Search. In order to qualify they had to score a 95% or better on a nationally standardized test.
- In grade 7, 51 % of our students qualified for the Duke Tip Talent Search Program. In order to qualify, students scored a 95% or better on a nationally standardized test. In addition to qualifying, 9 students qualified for State Recognition, 8 for the Academy of Summer Studies, and 3 for the top recognition in the country, Center for Summer Studies. These students qualified with scores on their SAT's.
- Twenty-five eighth and ninth grade students were inducted into the National Honor Society.
- Our eighth grade Math Counts Team placed 10th in the County and our seventh grade Math Counts Team scored tenth in the state
- Seventy-three of our students qualified for the National Presidential Physical Fitness Awards, and forty-two students qualified for the highest Presidential Honor.
- Girls' Varsity Sports Programs played for the league championship in all four seasons. PBDA was the only team in the Palm Coast Treasure League to do so.
- One of our students was one of 13 winners out of 700 students at the Florida Stage Montage

- All of our students have been engaged in major Community Service projects including recycling, Race for the Cure, Thanksgiving Dinners, Bradley's Christmas and Easter Breakfasts, Bicycle/sports equipment drive, Rwanda assembly and bracelet fund raising, Halloween costume drive, beach clean-up, used book drive, clothing drive, back pack project, adopted grandparents, cystic fibrosis Great Strides Program, Quantum House.

Pride in our School

- We are one of the few Independent Schools in the area that will begin the school year 2011-2012 with an increased enrollment.
- We continue to provide a curriculum that is challenging and engaging including high school credits in math, and foreign languages.
- We've made curriculum enhancements or additions in the following areas: Science (K-3), Advisory Program (5-9), 4th grade band, steel drum band, samba band, strings program, drama at 4th and 9th grades, musical expanded to 6th through 9th grades, vocal music, China partnership (now two way), Mandarin, International Studies, and our First Annual Evening for the Arts.
- Over 85% of our parents played a significant volunteer role in the school through our Parent School Council.
- Our parents have very generously supported our fund raising efforts this year with record attendance and support at both our Golf Tournament and Auction. Our Annual Fund is close to reaching its goal and 84 % of our parents have already contributed.
- Once again this year, we have been awarded the highest level of Green School of Excellence.

Pride in our Faculty

- We had three teachers nominated for a Dwyer Excellence in Teaching Award and one of our teachers was a finalist.
- Thirteen of our faculty members begin work on his or her Masters Degree on site this summer as part of a collaborative effort between PBDA and FAU. Once the members of our faculty complete this program that James Patterson has so generously sponsored, 85% of our classroom teachers will have graduate degrees.
- Our teachers have presented at National Conferences and we have launched a local network of teachers interested in the development of thinking. We have hosted visitors from around the County and 60 teachers attended the first meeting of our Collaborative for Making Thinking Visible.
- Our Advancement Department has enhanced their mentoring program, created an ambassador program, developed a new website, a new viewbook, Capital Campaign literature, presence on facebook, car magnets, and our new logo.

Pride in our Future

- Plans are complete and approved for the renovation of the Matthews Performing Arts Center and an Educational Building and Athletic and Performing Arts Center on the Lower Campus.
 - We have a strong Development Team and Leadership in place for the Great Expectations Campaign and are well on our way towards making our vision for the Palm Beach Day Academy become a reality. Are we going to rest on our laurels? One needn't worry about that at PBDA as I'm surrounded by other Type A's. Over the summer our teachers will be attending seminars, doing coursework, beginning graduate degrees, and developing curriculum. You can rest assured that at PBDA we'll never let it rest

and our better's best.*

2011 Bridge Ceremony

Primary student, **Audrey Kassewitz**, was brought on stage to receive a framed copy of her artwork which was chosen for the program cover. Then, Dr. Van presented the Adele Shook Merck Excellence in Teaching Award to **Mary Calhoun**.

Donna Tobey made an announcement naming the students whose standardized test scores qualify them to test for the Johns Hopkins University Center for Talented Youth Program - 54% of 1st and 2nd Graders.

The Bridge Ceremony ended with a special tribute to the 3rd Graders for whom this Bridge Ceremony serves as a symbolic passage over Royal Palm Bridge to the Upper Campus on Seaview Avenue in Palm Beach.

DUKE TIP QUALIFIERS

Eleven Palm Beach Day Academy Seventh Graders have qualified for special summer programs at Duke University. To qualify, students must first earn scores on their school's standardized tests that place them in the 95th percentile nationally. Students with such scores then have the option of taking the SAT or ACT in grades 7 - 9. Of the nineteen 7th Graders who took the tests, nine have achieved the State Qualifying Level. State Qualifiers must earn an SAT Math score of 520 or better, or an SAT Critical Reading score of 510 or better, or an SAT Writing score of 500 or better; or two of the three following scores: Math = 510, Critical

Reading = 500, Writing = 490. Grand Level Qualifiers must earn a SAT Math score of 670 or better, or an SAT Critical Reading score of 650 or better, or an SAT Writing score of 650 or better; or a combined SAT score of 1850 or better. Comparable ACT scores also qualify students.

THIRD GRADE MOCK TRIALS PACK A PALM BEACH COUNTY COURTROOM

“Objection your honor!” third grade student Adin McAuliffe called out unexpectedly, causing his classmate to think on the spot in front of over 60 supportive onlookers. On the morning of Friday, May 6th, the third grade students filed into Judge Rosenberg’s courtroom at the Palm Beach County Courthouse to hold two trials which would determine the fate of the imaginary community of Uville, a community the third grade students created earlier in the school year. “It was an experience I will remember for the rest of my life,” commented third grade student, Jonah Kotzen.

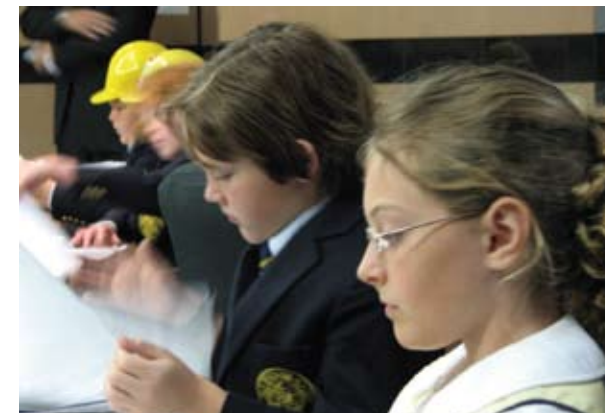
It all started when the students read the story of Roxoboxen in their Open Court Reading anthology. The story inspired students to create their own imaginary community. The third grade teachers decided to use the student-created community of Uville to give students a purpose for learning and a place to connect the content learned in

During their study of life science the students invented animals that could be classified by scientists and had realistic life cycles and habitats. The young scientists declared these animals to be endangered and would live in the wildlife area of Uville. When the list of necessary goods and services was developed and the

animals were all created, a conflict arose. If the citizens of Uville were to develop their community to include a neighborhood or a mall, the only area they could build on was the very wildlife area that was home to the student created endangered species. Although students worked to make compromises, it was determined that the best way to resolve the problem would be to take the issue to court – the Palm Beach County Courthouse that is.

their various classes. The community of Uville became the generative topic used to integrate the subjects of science, social studies, language arts, and writing. Once a week, the entire third grade met in one classroom to hold “town meetings,” where social studies concepts were used to guide decisions students made regarding Uville, such as how they would hold an election for Mayor of Uville and what goods and services were needed in Uville.

The Honorable Judge Rosenberg and State Attorney Michael McAuliffe, parents of third grade student Adin McAuliffe, generously offered to help the students and teachers with the process of creating and holding this trial. Both spent several days with students in the classroom and Judge Rosenberg presided over the trial.

The students had to decide whether they would fight to conserve the animals’ habitat or develop their growing community. Through the research process, the

developers discovered they had a better chance of being supported if their buildings were eco friendly while the conservationists came to understand how animals depend on their environment for survival.

The students began researching their own inquiries as they created the trial from scratch. Through this process, they enhanced their ability to evaluate and reason with evidence, inquire, make inferences, research, consider other people’s (and even animals’) points of views, and work cooperatively. The students were so engaged in this experience that they

took initiative, gathering research, interviewing experts, and making discoveries outside of school as well. Parent involvement played a major role in the success of this learning experience. State Attorney Michael McAuliffe, began working with the students and teachers to empower the students to make discoveries, and, through this experience, reach deeper understanding in all subject areas. Several parents like Greg Kino, Ken Ehrlich, and Jo Ann Barone generously offered their expertise in the areas of law, community development, and conservation as well. On the day of the trial, there was standing room only in Judge Rosenberg’s courtroom as parents

came out, not only to watch the two trials unfold, but also to see who would win the cases. It was up to the jurors who deliberated without the guidance of their teachers in the deliberation room after each trial. Parents, students, and teachers waited on the edge of their seats as the student bailiffs read the verdicts. The class that wanted to develop an eco friendly mall was not given permission to build while the class that fought to build an eco friendly neighborhood was granted permission.

The third grade teachers and students learned side by side during this experience as they deepened their understanding of the judicial system, communities, and wildlife preservation, while building a court case that will never be forgotten by this year’s Palm Beach Day Academy third grade students and teachers.

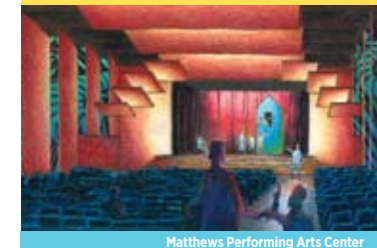

The Athletic and Performing Arts Center will be a multi-use building that will encourage participation in the performing arts, while providing for sports and fitness activities indoors.



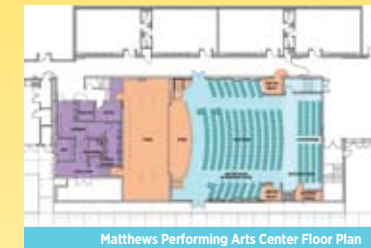

**FRANCES ARCHBOLD HUFTY
OCTOBER 17TH, 1912 – NOVEMBER 19TH, 2010**

Frances Hufty was the wife of long-time board member Paige Hufty. All five of their children attended Palm Beach Private School, and many of her grandchildren and great grandchildren attended or are attending Palm Beach Day. The Hufty family have been actively involved in our school community for over 70 years.



Frances Archbold Hufty

Frances Archbold Hufty, naturalist, civic leader, and conservationist, died Friday November 19th, 2010, in Palm Beach, Florida, surrounded by family and friends. Hers was a full life, well-lived, dedicated to her community, her family, and the natural world.

Born on October 17th, 1912 at the Ritz in New York City, Frances was the youngest child of May Barron Archbold and John Foster Archbold. She spent much of her childhood at Chinquapin Plantation, near Thomasville, Georgia, where she found her love of nature and the out-of-doors. She graduated from Miss Hall's school and took post-graduate courses at Miss Madeira's School at DuPont Circle in Washington DC after her father's death in her senior year of high school when she went to live with Anne Archbold's Hillandale Farm on Reservoir Road.

She was born into a family known for great philanthropic support of science, exploration, conservation, and hands on community service; her father founded the Archbold Hospital in Thomasville, Georgia in memory of his father, John Foster Archbold, the first president of Standard Oil of New Jersey. In Thomasville, they supported the Cooperative Quail Investigation (1924-1929), helping to pave the way for the establishment of the Tall Timbers Research Station in Thomasville, Georgia. She accompanied her aunt, Anne Mills Archbold to the Smithsonian Chichen excavations in 1931. Anne Archbold was a supporter of botanical exploration and research in the Pacific Ocean including funding and participating in the cruise of the Cheng Ho (1940) led by David Fairchild, tropical botanist explorer. Anne donated the land for Archbold Glover Park in Washington, DC.

Her brother, Richard Archbold, explorer and naturalist, founded Archbold Expeditions in 1936, and established the Archbold Biological Station in Lake Placid, Florida, in 1941. the parent organization of Archbold Biological Station and the MacArthur Agro-ecology Research Center, in Lake Placid, Florida. After Richard Archbold's death in 1976 she assumed

leadership of Archbold Expeditions, spending the next 34 years as Chairman of the Board. Frances successfully navigated the organization through many watershed events: independence of Archbold Expeditions from the American Museum of Natural History in 1981; the purchase of Lake Annie and surrounding lands in 1983; establishment of the MacArthur Agro-ecology Research Center (the Ranch) in conjunction with the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation in 1988; the purchase of the 3,648-acre Archbold Reserve in 2002; and the conceptual design and construction of the Adrian Archbold Lodge and Learning Center, named in honor of her brother Adrian. This Center, to be completed in 2011, will help transform environmental education throughout the subtropics.

Under her foresight and leadership Archbold Biological Station doubled in size to 8,841-acres, increasing vital protection for the globally threatened Florida scrub and its many rare plants and animals. Archbold science grew in international stature, generating fundamental and applied data for: guiding protection of the scrub; agro-ecology, to enable ecologically and economically sustainable working farms and ranches in the Northern Everglades; and restoration ecology, to restore the Archbold Reserve and other degraded lands. She rarely missed her weekly Thursday visits to the Station and the Ranch, happy to be out in the woods, the pastures, and the scrub, proudly wearing her favorite Archbold T-shirts featuring ants, flowers, cows, lizards, spiders, or snakes.

She had the incisive, questioning mind of a scientist, the love of learning of a scholar regularly attending scientific seminars, the curiosity of a field biologist, a genuine interest in agriculture, and an intuitive sense of the importance of place and stewardship. All her activities were enhanced by her sense of decorum, and good head for finances. She instilled love, loyalty, and legacy to ensure vibrant and enduring organizations.

Frances was an active gardener and lifetime member of the Garden Club of America of Palm Beach; she was awarded the Garden Club of America Conservation Committee Award, Zone VIII, and their national Conservation Achievement Award. Her charming and successful lakeside vegetable and butterfly garden in Palm Beach is a tiny living testament to her green thumb. She and her fellow garden club members were directly engaged in research projects on rare scrub plants at Carter Creek and Flamingo Villas in Highlands County. She chaired the board of Pine Jog Environmental Education Center in West Palm Beach for many years.

Her legacy includes pioneering activities in healthcare in Washington with the Columbia Lighthouse for the Blind. in Georgia with the Archbold Hospital Foundation and in Palm Beach at the Palm Beach Rehabilitation Center for Children and Adults. She was the first female board member of the Palm Beach Community Chest, Civic Committee, and United Way, and was active from the 1960s on the Board of Easter Seal. She was a member of the Palm Beach Bath and Tennis Club, the Chevy Chase Club of Washington DC, The Colonial Dames of America, the Colony Club of New York, the Everglades Club, and the Seminole Club. She was recipient of the Alexis de Tocqueville Award for Civic Excellence in 1991, and the Pine Jog Environmental Education Center Lifetime Achievement Award in 2010.

Frances and her beloved husband of 67 years, Page Hufty 1907-2001, raised five children and became pillars of the Palm Beach community. She is survived by all her children - John Hufty, Alexandra Anlyan, Frances Leidy, Page Lee Bell, Mary Hufty MD, and their spouses, Carol Vetter Hufty, William Anlyan MD, Theodore Bell, and Daniel Alegria MD, her grandchildren John Page Hufty, Donna Lloyd George, Miguel Reynal, Sebastian de Atucha, Carter Leidy III, Page Leidy, Frances MacKay, Benjamin Griswold, Alexander Griswold, Dylan Alegria, Loren Alegria, and 15 great grandchildren. Her last words were "I believe in the future". We owe this wonderful, elegant, modest, and charming woman a great deal for her most generous devotion to that future.
